



Free of Accidents/Hazards





The Resident Environment Remains as Free of Accident Hazards as Possible

Each Resident Receives Adequate Supervision and Assistance Devices to Prevent Accidents



Infection Prevention & Control

- Establish & Maintain an Infection Prevention and Control Program
- A System for Preventing, Identifying, Reporting, Investigating and Controlling Infections & Communicable Diseases for all Residents, Staff, Volunteers, Visitors and Other Individuals Providing Services Under Contractual Arrangement Based Upon the Facility Assessment and Following Accepted National Standards



Quality of Care



Fundamental Principle that Applies to all Treatment and Care Provided to Facility Residents



Based on the comprehensive assessment of a resident, the facility must ensure that residents receive treatment and care in accordance with professional standards of practice, the comprehensive person-centered care plan, and the residents' choices



Abuse & Neglect

The resident has the right to be free from abuse, neglect, misappropriation of resident property, and exploitation as defined in this subpart. This includes but is not limited to freedom from corporal punishment, involuntary seclusion and any physical or chemical restraint not required to treat the resident's medical symptoms.

Not use verbal, mental, sexual, or physical abuse, corporal punishment, or involuntary seclusion



Activities of Daily Living Care

 A resident who is unable to carry out activities of daily living receives the necessary services to maintain good nutrition, grooming, and personal and oral hygiene.



Food Procurement, Store/Prepare/Serve



Procure Food from Sources Approved or Considered Satisfactory by Federal, State or Local Authorities



Store, Prepare, Distribute and Serve Food In Accordance with Professional Standards for Food Safety

 Certify nursing homes or distinct self- contained units within existing nursing homes for behavioral management of persons with a high risk of aggression.






Distressed Facilities

 The Department will, by rule, adopt criteria to identify distressed facilities and shall publish a list of distressed facilities quarterly.





AED Requirements



• A facility shall ensure they have an automated external defibrillator & policies/procedures for rendering of the AED in the facility.
